The Pirate House (Restaurant) is the oldest building in Savannah, GA. Initially built as part of the Chelsea Botanical Garden, it converted to a tavern after the people of Savannah deemed the arboretum not relevant anymore. Reported to have developed into a haven for pirate, The Pirate House received many well known swashbucklers of the day. (It is maintained Robert Louis Stevenson authored a part of his famed “Treasured Island” here.)
